History Room News

HOLYOKE HISTORY ROOM RECEIVES GRANT TO DIGITIZE VHS RECORDINGS DOCUMENTING LOCAL PUERTO RICAN AND LATINO CULTURE AND POLITICS

The Holyoke History Room of the Holyoke Public Library has received a Recordings at Risk grant of \$14,644 from the Council on Library and Information Resources (CLIR) to digitize more than 100 video recordings of the bilingual *Vecinos/Neighbors* community access television program, filmed in and around Holyoke in the early 1990s.

The grant will also fund digitization of a portion of the History Room’s La Familia Hispana, Inc. tape collection. Recordings at Risk, funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, is a competitive, national regranting program aimed at preserving historically-valuable recorded material endangered by deterioration and format obsolescence.

The *Vecinos/Neighbors* program, produced by Carlos Vega, Sylvia Galván, and Gary O’Connor, ran on community access television from 1991-1996.

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It sought to connect viewers with reliable information on issues such as voting, redistricting, education, and community development, while also featuring local artists, performers, and footage from the Hispanic Family Festival. The digitization project will also include tapes made by Carlos Vega and others in the course of their community work in the 1990s. Both tape collections were donated to the Library in 2018 with the mutual goal of preserving their content and sharing it with the public.



Much of the content will be available for online viewing after completion of the project in mid-2020. Interview with Tom Kass- History room volunteer.

I have been coming to the Holyoke library for over 25 years. Many of my visits were to the History room when Paul Graves was the historian. I got more involved with the history room about 8 years ago and began doing more research into my Holyoke ancestors who first moved here in 1868.

In May I did a presentation at the library on a history of golf in Holyoke. Also in May I led a tree tour through Holyoke which was sponsored in part by the library.

I have helped out in the history room for a few years but last year I became an official volunteer. The daily duties are often interrupted by walk in patrons who are usually searching for people or information from the past. This can be the rewarding part of the volunteer job. Finding information from the past can be almost like finding buried treasure and people are often very grateful when their questions get answered.

The archivist in charge of the collection, Eileen Crosby, does an excellent job of helping patrons use the resources in the history room and with their research. Other researchers of local history often do presentations on various subjects at the library. These are library events that I attend whenever possible. They use the history room’s resources to prepare their talks as well.

Although there are things which could be added, even without those resources the library’s history room is a valuable resource for studying local history and Holyoke is lucky to have it. – Tom K.

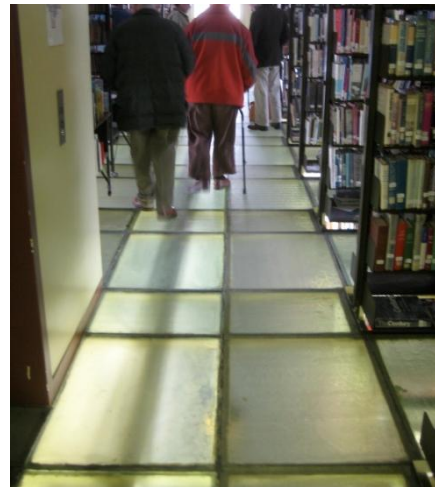

Fundraiser- Glass Blocks

When the Library was renovated, Glass floor panels (a.k.a. "glass blocks") were saved from the 1902 stack wing. These now are for sale as part of the Holyoke Public Library's fundraising campaign.



Glass blocks come in several sizes (rounded to nearest half inch): Size A (34.5 x 36"), B (34.5 x 27"), C (34.5 x 25"), D (19 x 23.5"), E or F (19 x 26-27"). Each panel is 1" thick, very sturdy and heavy. Own a piece of library history! Prices range from \$50- \$140.
