The Summer Reading program ran from June 27<sup>th</sup> through August 2nd for kids and teens. Adult programming lasted until August 8th.



The Holyoke Public Library hosted a kickoff party on June 27<sup>th</sup> which had many people playing games, doing the scavenger hunt and eating Free ice cream.

Over the course of the summer, we had 5,673 building visits and Circulation Staff handled 1,125 questions at the main desk. We also had three days in July when we had over 300 visits to the building. This is an excellent number!

Open your browser, go to print.princh.com and enter the 6-digit library code (109284) to select the printer or click this link <a href="Princh.com">Princh.com</a>, to have the number prepopulated.

- When printing at the library: locate the print guide poster near the printer and scan the QR code.
- -Once on Princh.com, Upload your document, enter your email, proceed to the Print Release Terminal and pay for your print job.
- **Then,** once your documents are sent, come to the library to pick them up. <u>Click for more info</u>



# Polish and Eastern European Immigration in the Industrial Era- Holyoke & Western Mass - Saturday, October 26, 2024, 1:00 PM in the Holyoke Public Library Community Room

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, people from Poland and other Eastern Europe countries immigrated to Western Massachusetts in significant numbers. Many in the upper Pioneer Valley farmed the rich soils in Franklin and Hampshire Counties; others came to work in the mills and factories in Holyoke and Chicopee. Join us as Robert Forrant, Distinguished University Professor of History at the University of Massachusetts Lowell, brings his expertise in the history of labor, industrialization, and deindustrialization in New England to the topic of Polish immigration to the area. This talk is a prelude to "New Roots In River Banks: Contributions of Polish & Other Eastern European Immigrants to the Connecticut River *Valley*, " a traveling exhibit from the Pocumtuck Valley Memorial Association opening on November 16 at Holyoke Heritage State Park.



The teens involved will share what they've learned from their friends, family, and community members, followed by Yanira sharing the sound scaping, having a talkback, as well as conversation with the audience


around their memories of land in relation to liberation. Scan the code to Hear the stories.


Announcing HPL's Holyoke Halloween! A week of spooktastic fun with events for all ages! Starting October 23rd till Halloween!
