


Fall Programming



Mobile Printing and Faxing Available

Need to print from your computer or mobile device? Don't have a printer? Use this:

- Printing from your laptop or mobile device:

Open your browser, go to print.princh.com and enter the 6-digit library code (109284) to select the printer or click this link <u>Princh.com</u>, to have the number prepopulated.

- When printing at the library: locate the print guide poster near the printer and scan the QR code
- -Once on Princh.com, Upload your document, enter your email, proceed to the Print Release Terminal and pay for your print job.
- Then, once your documents are sent, come to the library to pick them up. Click for more info



Need to send a Fax?

From your phone or computer/tablet, go to Faxscan24.com and follow instructions to input fax number and payment. Also, Fax in person from the fax machine on the first floor. \$1.75 for the first page and \$1.00 for every page after that (20 pgs max per scan) Pay with credit/debit card or buy a prepaid card at the front desk.





Librarian's Adventure

I went to the Haskell Free Library and Opera House on July 26th. Part of it is in Derby Line, Vermont and the other part in Stanstead, Quebec. You can cross the border within the library itself, but you have to exit the side you came in through. The library/opera house is not an official border crossing. You cannot cross the border outside the building on the property. The US side uses the main entrance and the Canadian side uses an emergency/smaller exit to go in and out. Both have their own parking lots and even street address for both countries. The patrons who live in Canada and are members of the library, used to be able to enter and exit from both the US and Canadian side, but this was changed.



They have a mix of **English and French** just like we have a mix of English and Spanish collection here. Staff can be both from the US and Canada.

They also show off the old way libraries used to keep track of what is in and out of


their collections by using wooden books with the titles on the spine. These are now only on display.
