Mobile Printing and Faxing Available

Need to print from your computer or mobile device? Don't have a printer? Use this:

- Printing from your laptop or mobile device:

Open your browser, go to print.princh.com and enter the 6-digit library code (109284) to select the printer or click this link Princh.com, to have the number prepopulated.

- When printing at the library: locate the print guide poster near the printer and scan the QR code.

-Once on Princh.com, Upload your document, enter your email, proceed to the **Print Release Terminal** and pay for your print job.

- Then, once your documents are sent, come to the library to pick them up. [Click for more info](#)



Need to send a Fax?

From your phone or computer/tablet, go to Faxscan24.com and follow instructions to input fax number and payment. Also, Fax in person from the fax machine on the first floor. \$1.75 for the first page and \$1.00 for every page after that (20 pgs. max per scan) Pay with credit/debit card or buy a prepaid card at the front desk.

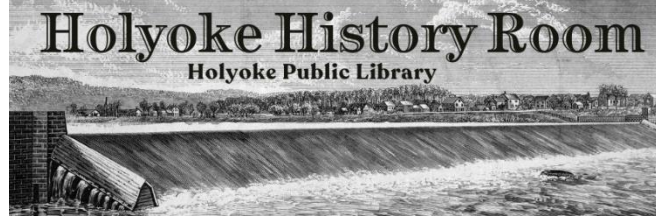

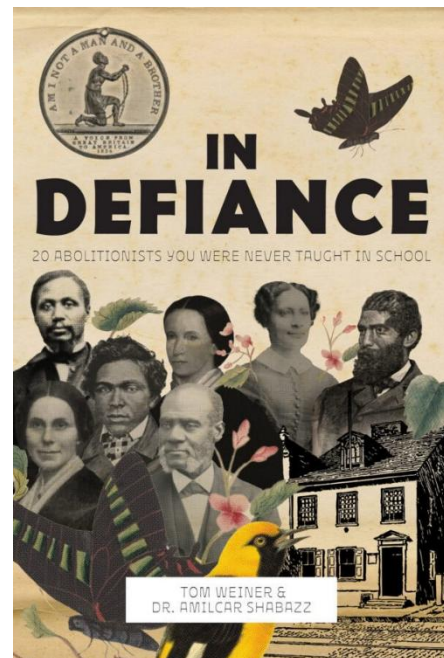

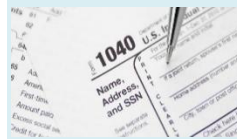
